SUBJ; Practice Beacons

Reference CAPR 100-1 Volume 1 para 6-6.

1. All of the Mississippi Wing practice beacons are Cadet 6000 units, and all operate on frequency 121.775 Mhz.
2. It is no longer mandantory to notify the FAA when using these beacons, but it would be advisable to contact your local airports and/or flight station and advise them of expected time on the time off.
3. Anyone operating the practice beacon must have an ROP 76 card, and a log kept of it's useage. All practice beacons should be stored in a medium ammo box, with a log book, a copy of the license in the log book, pen, antenna, and beacon. With every use, the following will be annotated.
  - a. Date and time of turn on.
  - b. Location of operation, and mission number if known.
  - c. Time of turn off.
  - d. Notation of how unit operated and was received, if known.
  - e. Printed name, call sign, and signature of operator.
4. The person in charge (POC), location, serial number, and license number of beacon is listed below.
