SUBJECT: Operations Order for Color Guard Competition

**1. DESCRIPTION:** The Mississippi Wing Color Guard Competition is an annual event in which cadet color guard teams compete to represent the Mississippi Wing at the Southeast Region Cadet Competition. This activity will be held at Mississippi Wing Headquarters on 18 Feb 2012 and will begin at 0830. The winning team will be expected to represent the Mississippi Wing at the Southeast Region Cadet Competition on 16-18 March at Maxwell AFB, AL.

**2. ELIGIBILITY:**

**Cadet**

- Must have completed achievement one (cadet officers cannot participate on a team)
- Must be on the Monthly Membership Listing (MML) at the time of the competition
- Cadets 18 and over must have completed Cadet Protection Policy Training (CPPT)

**Senior Members**

- Must have completed level one and Cadet Protection Policy Training (CPPT)
- Must be on the Monthly Membership Listing (MML) at the time of the competition.

**3. APPLICATION PROCEDURES:** E-mail the following information to [JasonDiaz@cableone.net](mailto:JasonDiaz@cableone.net) no later than **10 February**:

**Team Applications**

- Name, grade, and age of all four primary members (and alternate, if used)
- Name of senior member that will be escorting the team to the competition
- Date and approximate time of arrival

**Staff Applications**

Staff members will be needed to support the competition in areas such as: judges, test proctors, time keepers, recorders, line judges, event marshallars, panel quiz moderator, and other duties. If you have a preference, please state so in an e-mail to [JasonDiaz@cableone.net](mailto:JasonDiaz@cableone.net). Please include those areas you are willing to help out with so that appropriate placement can be made.

**4. TRANSPORTATION:** Transportation to and from such activity is not the responsibility of CAP and is provided "as available". Privately owned vehicles travel to or from such activity is performed strictly at the member's own risk (reference CAPR 77-1, para 6c and CAPR 52-16, para 8-10) and is not under CAP direction and control. Transportation during the activity will NOT be provided.

**5. LODGING INFORMATION:** Team members and their senior member escort may use Wing Headquarters for billeting. If you plan on doing this, please indicate this when you register your team with Maj Diaz.

**6. MEALS:** No meals will be provided at the competition. Team members should make plans for lunch during the designated time (and breakfast, if the team stays Friday night).

**7. UNIFORM:** Each team will be given a schedule on events at the time of check-in. This schedule of events will be used to determine what uniform will be worn throughout the course of the day's competition.

**8. EQUIPMENT LIST:** Teams should bring all required equipment to perform in the competition as stated in the competition guidelines.

**9. COMPETITION REGULATIONS:** Teams will be judged in accordance with CAPM 52-4, dated 02 June 2009 (clarification on questions from leadership and aerospace textbook: questions will come from Learn to Lead and Aerospace Dimensions 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition, as well as other sources cited in CAPM 52-4).

**10. TEAM RESPONSIBILITIES:** The teams are responsible for the following:

1. Transportation to/from and during activity.
2. A TEAM escort for all cadets, in accordance with the CPPT for overnight activities.
3. Follow all CAP regulatory publications.
4. Conduct of all members of their team, sponsors, and spectators.
